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Rural car maker's skills acknowledged

LIMPOPO'S own Henry Paul, Ngweni Mahana, has been given a chance to become a qualified motor mechanic.

The 29 year old from Ngweni village outside Gwesu has been making his own cars from scrap metal since he was 12 school years.

Now he has been offered a two-year learnership by Nissan SA and is receiving intensive training at EE Motors in Tzaneen.

"When I started out, making scrap metal to make my first car, people laughed at me, saying that I had lost my mind," Mahana said.

Mahana was in Grade 11 when he made an electric car, which was first prize at the Edman Expo for Young Scientists.

It was later bought by a businessman for R30 000.

His second car, called the Aquana, runs on a 50 litre petrol tank, and is

powered by a generator and has a top speed of 150km/h. It has a clutch, brake and accelerator pedals, four shock absorbers, an exhaust system, a heater, as well as air gear, including reverse.

Mahana can even drive the vehicle at night because it has an effective lighting system which is connected to an ordinary car battery. He believes that one day he will get a roadworthy certificate to use his car on public roads.

"I had one more than two years to make this car but it is not yet finished. I still have to provide it with a handbrake, windows and a powerful music system," he said with a smile.

The rural car maker passed matric in 2007, but could not pursue his dream of becoming an engineer because of poverty at home. He is one of nine children and both his

parents are unemployed.

"My dad has gone to his village and create much-needed jobs," he said.

Daniel Malgola, a trainer at Nissan SA in Pretoria, said Mahana was one of about 30 students who had been enrolled at different dealerships across the country.

"They are learning to service, repair and overhaul the mechanical parts of a car. They will also attend classes and, upon completion of the two-year course, they will become qualified technicians and issued with relevant certificates," he said.

Mahana received the training programme last month and is expected to graduate in October 2011.

"I want to thank Nissan for recognizing my talent and giving me this opportunity," he said.

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Three arrested for dagga

If you should receive such a fax or phone call, contact an alternative Telkom line or customer before taking any further action.

Mentally disabled patients and the psychiatric ward staff marched to the streets of Nkunasundwa with the aim of informing local residents of the difficulties and stigmas attached to mental illnesses.

The team wore advocacy T-shirts to attract the public's interest and held placards that read, "My child with mental illness is still my child."

Senior Psychiatrist of Letaba Hospital, Dr Abena Ndala, said the Mental Health Day Act emphasizes that people with mental disabilities need to be reintegrated into their communities so they can become active participants and improve on self-esteem.

She said after the march she hopes that the community will have a change of heart and treat those who are suffering from these disabilities with love, despite their mental status.

World Health Organisation estimates that by 2020 depression will be the second biggest health burden world wide.

Many people who experience mental health problems, are verbally and physically abused. They apparently feel less frightened to tell others of their problems because of the prejudice and discrimination associated with mental illness. Mentally disabled people suffer more difficulty than any other disabled group in finding employment.
